AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE USE OF FIREARMS

THE VILLAGE OF LAKEWOOD CLUB ORDAINS:

Section 1. That no person except a police officer or other peace officer in the discharge of his duty, shall fire a revolver, pistol, shotgun, rifle, air rifle, bow and arrow, slingshot (amended 6/27/94) or other dangerous weapon within the Village of Lakewood Club; provided however, that nothing contained in this Ordinance shall prohibit the Village Council from granting permission for the maintenance of shooting galleries, target ranges or other use of firearms under suitable regulations for the protection and safety of the citizens and inhabitants of the Village of Lakewood Club and in strict observance of conservation rules and practices, viz:

1. a, b, & c amended 6/27/94 to read:

- a. Handguns, bows and arrows, rifles and shotguns may be discharged in Section 6 of said Village provided no firearm shall be discharged or ammunition propelled within one hundred (100) yards of any building residence or structure occupied by persons or animals.
- b. Under age eighteen (18) years of age are not allowed to handle any firearm, etc. without parent or guardian present.
- c. Bow and Arrow practice in a controlled environment shall be permitted, except where otherwise restricted in this ordinance.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to hunt wild game or fowl or in any manner, carry any gun, weapon or firearm for the purpose of hunting game or fowl within the Village limits of Lakewood Club except as may be allowed under sub-paragraphs a, b, or c (amended 6/27/94), of Section 1 above.

Section 3. That all weapons, guns, pistols, or firearms carried, possessed, or used contrary to the preceding sections are hereby declared forfeited to the Village of Lakewood Club.

Section 4. That any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be subject to a fine not to exceed the sum of \$500.00, or the imprisonment for a

period not exceeding 90 days or both, such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the Court.

Section 5. Ordinance #11 shall within five (5) days after its adoption, and before it shall become effective, be legally published in a newspaper of general circulation within the Village.

Section 6. All ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed. It is further ordained, that if any of the above stipulations be held invalid, it shall not affect the remaining conditions of the ordinance.

Section 7. This ordinance shall become effective upon publication.
